#### **Planning For The Future!**

Over the years, various memorial, or legacy gifts, were donated to our church in memory of a person's life. The most recent gift was from a faithful member of the church, Cleo Hosler. These gifts are always appreciated, and great consideration is given in how those gifts are used if not specified by the donor. Over the years legacy gifts have ranged anywhere from a few hundred dollars to over one hundred thousand dollars.

The amount of the gift is not important, but what is special about each of these gifts is that the donor, or the donor's family, chose to leave a legacy gift for the Lord in memory of a loved one. If you would like to leave a legacy gift to the church or any other ministry, your gift can make a difference for future generations. If you would like to know more about leaving a legacy gift the first step would be for you to talk to your family and attorney for guidance.

That leads me to my topic for this month, "planning for the future... or planning for end of life." Hebrews 9:7 reminds us that, "we are destined to die." It is a fact of life that none of us will escape unless Jesus Christ returns while we are still living! Today's funerals are so diverse that one rarely resembles another. There are many options available to personalize the funeral or memorial service. One thing to consider, as one funeral director indicated, "the funeral service is to pay tribute to the deceased, but also, a funeral is for the living."

A funeral service is a time when loved ones and friends can gather to support one another, and, a time to celebrate the legacy of the one who has passed into eternity.

Most people do not like to think about the end stages of life, but I would like to encourage you to pray about, and give some thought to planning for your funeral service to help your loved ones who will oversee your funeral preparations. Some of the things you could begin doing are:

First and most important, as your pastor, my prayer is that you know where you stand in your relationship with Jesus. Having Jesus as your Lord and Savior, and knowing that Heaven will be your home for eternity is the most important thing for your family and your pastor to know! Knowing you have asked Jesus into your heart is helpful information for the pastor who does your funeral message.

Meet with a local funeral home. There are many good funeral homes in the area. The various funeral directors can provide you with information sheets to help you with the pre-planning process and to answer questions you have. Doing this does not obligate you to use their services in the future, however, once you decide on a place you would like to use, many places offer pre-payment options that can help relieve any financial burdens on your family. You might want to consider providing them a copy of your pre-planning information once it is completed (it can always be updated or changed as necessary).

**Meet with your pastor.** A pastor wants to be able to personalize the funeral service as much as possible. The information they gather often comes from meeting with family and friends who share stories about their loved one. This is very helpful, but to be able to hear some of those special things personally from you are even more helpful. This is also a time when the pastor can learn of your favorite scriptures, songs, or any other special details they could share about you. I also see a funeral service as a worship service and always share a gospel message as part of the service, even if it is a simple graveside service.

Meet with an attorney. There are many special things to consider when planning the details of your estate and how you would like that to be divided out when you pass away.

Be sure to leave the information about your funeral wishes in your lock box, with a funeral home director, a pastor of your church, or with someone else you can trust.

There are many things to consider in end of life planning, but it is something we will all face someday. Plan now to help make your Homecoming to Jesus special for all those left behind.

Some funeral homes offer services where they can come and share general information to a church and talk about end of life planning in a small group setting. If you are interested in this, please speak to me or indicate you would be interested on the communication slip on your weekly bulletin. If enough people would be interested in something like this, we may be able to set one up in the future.



Exciting News from Paw Packs!!!


During the month of June you will see a new small building appearing on church grounds. A much needed food storage building will be placed on site by Esh's to alleviate the storage needs of our program. It will house our own refrigerator and freezer along with additional cabinets and shelving to store food. Presently, we have to shop every week for some of the items that we hand out because we have nowhere to store large quantities of them. The project is being funded through grants and private donations that we have been blessed to receive.

Thanks to everyone who purchased a meal from our Redemption BBQ fundraiser. We sold 156 meals and profited \$825, part of which was a donation from Redemption BBQ. We will be selling walking tacos at the Fountain Festival on June 16th and 17th. Please stop by and say hello. Jeanne and Dave Young are planning their "Ride for a Purpose" motorcycle ride for August 5th. Help spread the word so we have a successful turnout.

PAW Packs continues to see God's hand in everything we do. On Wednesday, May 17th we discovered that our freezer that we just purchased in late February malfunctioned and we had to take 380 pounds of spoiled meat to the landfill. When we scrambled to get meat to hand out that Friday, we were gifted 50 pounds of ground beef by a person who had previously benefited from our program. That same week, the crew from Giant Foods came in to help pack. Several of the ladies in the group heard what happened and wrote personal checks to help us recoup some of what we lost. We have been so blessed! As we continue our work this summer with our pick up program, we ask for your prayers and thank you for your continued support. All are welcome to join in.








Congratulations to Karen Weaver and Jim Orner who were united in marriage on Saturday, April 22, 2023.

- 3. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family as they join in our congregation. Praise God for such down to earth people and what they mean to each of us. Please lift up the other Pastors in our church and their families, too.
- 4. Praise God for the opportunity He has given our church to have multiple outreach ministries in our community. Likewise, that He has provided opportunities and funds to support missions through out our country and elsewhere in the world to spread the Word of Jesus' love.
- 5. Praise God for the gardens growing and the excitement of watching the crops coming on. Pray for those who operate heavy farm or construction machinery, that safety will prevail.

- 9. Pray for the teens of our church, that they will have the courage to stand for their beliefs, and respect for their parents and others who help them on their way to adulthood. May their faith stay strong and may they find their place in fitting in God's family and their own special talents in service.
- 10. Praise God that He allows us to experience joy, happiness and love in our lives. Is there any kindness we can extend to others to make them smile? Maybe even anonymously.
- 11. Praise God for Camp Yolijwa and what it means to all who go there. And it is right in our back yard! We can actually go there pretty much any time we want.

- 22. Pray for people who only feel good about themselves when they are putting others down. Pray they'll come to understand that God loves each of us the same, that we are basically saying He is wrong when we say nasty things about His loved ones.
- 23. Pray for all the women of our church, that they will show respect and love to their families, as Christ commands and grow in their faithful relationship with Jesus.
- 24. Praise God just because He made YOU. You don't have to be perfect. Except for the Trinity no one else in the Bible was. Yet God used them in mighty ways. If He could use them, He can certainly use you and the gifts He made specifically in you.
- 25. Pray for our troops, where they are, that they will be totally safe in all facets of their lives and can soon be home with their loved ones. Pray for their families too, while they are away.
- 26. Pray for all those going on mission trips or local service projects. Safety and encouragement for those going and softened hearts and receptive ears for those who will be in the host area. Blessings the whole way around for everyone involved.
- 27. Praise God that we have the chance to help some of our young people go to church camp. So many of the kids receive Christ as their Lord there. It's another way to do mission work.

Can you imagine what that must be like? Pray for those innocent ones who are there, with no choice. Pray that those plotting evil will be stopped dead in their tracks.
