#### Prayers of Lament

Do you find yourself facing struggles with daily life??? If so, I hope you will find this month's newsletter article helpful to you!

Recently we walked through the Let's Pray study on prayer with Pastor Dave Williams. We learned many things from those sessions on various forms of prayer. The long and short of it is "prayer is talking and listening to our Heavenly Father." It is communicating with God!

One of the types of prayer we learned about was prayers of "lament". A prayer of lament is, "expressing sorrow, pain, or confusion." A prayer of lament is a way Christians can process grief in God's presence.

Because many Christians grew up in churches that teach you to "look at the bright side" (and we should always try to look at the bright side of things), when those life struggles hit you, to pray a prayer of lament can be helpful, but difficult for you to do.

But the world is broken . . . and at times, our lives feel broken. We see and experience sadness, sickness and sorrow every day. The news broadcasts are filled with depressing stories. But bringing it closer to home, we know friends and families in our community, as well as many in our church family who are going through some difficult seasons of life.

What is a Christian to do with all this sorrow? We must take it to the Lord!

Almost a third of the Psalms and the entire book of Lamentations are concerned with lament. Like every other emotion, God wants to hear about our pain. God wants us to lament to Him.

The Psalms are prayers and songs that give us words to help us through those times when we are fatigued, confused, or numb. If we're honest, some of the Psalms are more easy to read and pray than others. When life is good, it is easy to pray, "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?" (Psalm 27:1). But when life gets tough, we hesitate to pray, "Why, O Lord, do you stand far away? Why do you hide yourself in times of trouble?" (Psalm 10:1).

So how do you pray when you are struggling with things in your daily life that are so hurtful, or even those times that makes you want to be angry with God? Elaine recently shared with me one of her daily email devotions

from Ann Wilson, Co-Host of Family Life Ministries about prayer. I'd like to share it with you to help you during those times when you struggle with prayer.

Dear Friends,

I've been through a lot of hard seasons in life. I think we all have. When my sister passed away, she left her kids aged 9 to 20 without a mother. Man, how my heart broke—not only for her household but for myself. My best friend was gone.

I remember how my heart ached and how I struggled to process the anguish I felt. Worshiping God was hard. I was disappointed and overwhelmed. Yet, I still had life to do—I had to be a mom, a wife, a friend, an aunt—but I didn't know how to carry on.

While I didn't grow up in the church, I had a relationship with Jesus from a young age. I knew God was someone I could talk to. So I got into the habit of talking to Him honestly. I would even talk to Him as I chauffeured my kids around.

"God, I'm so mad at You today!"

"God, I really need You today!"

"I see no sense in this! I can't see a good thing in it."

I remember one time—in the middle of this deep pain—I collapsed on my bathroom floor and cried out to God:

"God, I don't feel any good at this point, but I will submit and give all this to You because I know You love me, I know You love her, and I know she's with You."

That honest, desperate plea is what prayer became to me. I didn't lose my faith by telling God I was hurt or angry. I lamented, and God drew near to me when I was breaking.

Prayer doesn't have to look like a perfect Christian giving a Sunday school message. Prayer is about coming to God just as we are, whether we're in celebration of His goodness or in deep despair during a season we don't understand. In fact, David wept before the Lord and was angry with Him. The same David who wrote Psalm 148 wrote Psalm 44.

No matter what you are walking through right now—the most joyful or sorrowful season—you can pray. You can pray to God who hears you, sees you, and feels with you. You can begin praying today by seeing your connection to God as a relationship. Just as I can say to Dave (my husband), "I'm struggling today," and he will comfort me, I can say to God, "I'm struggling today," and He—The God of Comfort—will embrace me.

If there is something in your life you are struggling with right now, I encourage you to take time and pray a prayer of lament. You may even find it helpful to journal your prayers by writing them out. And as always, if we can pray for you in some specific way, please share the need with us.





- 1. Tonight is National Night Out in Newville, where you can get out and meet the EMTs, police, firefighters and other First Responders. Pray for them and safety in all their coming and goings. It could be a good time to thank them for what they do and let them know you appreciate them and are covering them in prayer. It will mean more than you imagine.
- 2. Pray for those who are dealing with anxiety, panic, anger or frustration issues, that God's peace will blanket over them and they will be able to hand it all over to God once and for all.
- 3. Praise God that He still performs miracles, just as He did all through history. He still takes care of us in ways we have no comprehension of. But we do need to be asking for His will to be done and praying repentantly and expectantly. Our country is obviously in big trouble. But we can still stand for His truth in our words and actions, not with violence but with our prayers and how/where we spend our dollars. As God said to Moses, "Stand firm, for I am with you". He and His angels will fight the evil in this country. We need to do our part.
- 4. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family, for continued blessings in all areas of their lives. Likewise, pray for all the other pastors in our church and their families for blessings as they serve.
- 5. Today is the motorcycle/car ride for Paw Packs. It meets at the church at 9:00 am. Pray for good weather and complete safety for everyone involved. Pray that it will be a witness to all those who see it, of what can be accomplished when many gather to put their efforts into something so important.
- 6. Pray for all the men and boys of our church, for a closeness and love for Jesus that surpasses all understanding.
- 7. Pray that Child Evangelism will be successful in bringing children to know Jesus as their Savior, and have a good attendance. They do important work and need to get through to these children before they are "taught" what the world would have them to believe.
- 8. Pray for those being treated unkindly, that the circumstances will change and God's love will shine through to them.
- 9. Pray for those who are involved in wrecks, that no one will be badly hurt and there will not be anger or rage. May God can send His angels to protect even when we don't always give them the credit they deserve.
- 10. Praise God for your family and friends. Pray for all areas of their life, especially their salvation. It appears we may be living in the end times. Now is not the time to stay quiet about something as important as where they will spend eternity. Browbeating is not recommended, but letting them know you are concerned for them is a good thing.
- 11. Praise God that He loves us enough to bless us and not treat us the way we often deserve.
- 12. Praise God for making all the outreach ministry possibilities available to us. There are many opportunities to pick from. They are all important and you know that your donations are going to where you designate them. You are not expected to cover all of them. Just choose the one(s) God is encouraging you to support at that time. But, it does not have to cost a lot. Praying for each mission is free, yet the greatest donation you can make.
- 13. Pray for the women and girls of our church, that each one will grow deeper in an unshakeable love for Jesus.
- 14. Pray for all those involved in our church council meetings, that it will be productive and reflect God's plans for our church outreach. Pray that the Holy Spirit will be present and leading all discussions and ideas presented.
- 15. Pray for the trustees and others who do "behind the scenes work" for wisdom and ability to perform their mission for the Lord.
- 16. Praise God that we can know and enjoy many other believers from various places, getting a head start on knowing them in Heaven.
- 17. Pray for those having a hard time letting go of loved ones who have left them. Pray they will get God's peace washing over them to take the pain away.
- 18. Pray that the Night of Worship tonight will be successful, with a good turnout and great touches on the souls of all those who attend.
- 19. Praise God for 4 (or more) wonderful blessings He has given to you. I bet, when you think about it, it's hard to stop at 4.
- 20. Pray for our troops and their families wherever they may be. Pray for their safety and emotional well being, too.
- 21. Pray for those who have received a terminal diagnosis (and their families). If there will be a miracle GREAT! But pray they will find Christ and know there is a better future and hope ahead.
- 22. Praise God that He has a plan for your life, that He had in mind long before you were conceived. YOU are no accident!
- 23. Pray that the media will become unbiased in their reporting and portrayal of Christians and others. Pray that the double standards and drama will be stopped and they will report just the facts and no more misinformation. Just the facts.
- 24. Pray that the Holy Spirit will ignite people's hearts to follow God closely, causing a revival across the land and around the world. No more catering to what offends people when their wishes go against God's will. Not hate speech, but standing strong in our faith. How will we answer God on Judgement Day?
- 25. Pray for those dealing with allergies and severe breathing problems. High heat and humidity can make it hard to get enough air.
- 26. Pray for those pressured to join a gang or commit violence. Pray God will intervene and send someone to show them a better way.
- 27. Thank God for His awesomeness. When we think of His power, we can't even begin to comprehend all He can do!
- 28. Pray for those Senior members of our church that they will be safe, enjoying major spiritual growth and fun. There is so much we can learn from them!
- 29. Pray that the economy will improve to where people can afford to eat and pay their bills and for medications, to not have to make those choices of which to give up. Pray that there will be fiscal responsibility in the way our tax money is spent so that our country can return to the values we grew up with, that will cover all people without bankrupting all it's citizens.
- 30. Pray for safety for farmers and other operators of big machinery and those around them. Harvest time will be coming and sometimes when people get in a hurry, accidents happen.
- 31. Pray that we may get some good soaking rain that will help with crops and heat, and maybe put an end to the wildfires.
