

# Merry Christmas from all of us at Paw Packs.



- 1. Pray for Israel. As we hear stories of them being in war, it sounds like more Bible prophecy being fulfilled. To follow God's will, we need to pray for His "chosen people".
- 2. Continue to pray for the Shoeboxes as they make their way to their destinations. Pray that each person who comes into contact with them will be changed for the better.
- 3. Praise God for the beauty of the Advent season and the Hanging of the Greens service. What better way to start the Christmas season?
- 4. Praise God if you can breathe deeply naturally. Many people have asthma, emphysema, allergies, COPD or other problems where normal air intake is a rare thing. Lack of oxygen can be rough. Pray for those on inhalers or oxygen, especially if the electric goes off.
- 5. Pray for all the widows and widowers in our church/area. We have lost quite a few people recently and it is very rough on those left behind. Especially the spouses. Factor in the Holidays coming up and it can be a miserably hard time. Please keep them in your prayers and if possible do something tangible for them to let them know they are not forgotten.
- 6. Praise God for all the colors, sights, scents, tastes of this season. It is a great gift to be able to perceive them. Think of the blind and those who can't smell or taste. We who can are blessed indeed.
- 7. As Christmas draws closer and so many folks are in rough shape financially, pray they won't do anything foolish or desperate. Pray they will find help legally through God's power, and be covered with blessings and peace.
- 8. Pray for Neighbors in Christ, the Salvation Army and other groups who help people. Pray there will be enough to fill all the needs of those coming for help, especially as there is so much more need every day.
- 9. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family, for peace, joy and good health throughout their lives. May their faith shine through to all they encounter.
- 10. Praise God for all the men and boys of our church, that each one will be a leader in bringing others to live for Jesus.
- 11. Pray for our Council as they meet to figure out how God wants to use our church family and facilities to help others to meet Jesus as their Lord. Pray the board members will be blessed for their devotion.
- 12. Pray for those dealing with diabetes, etc. It can be an especially hard time of the year with all the extra goodies Pray for their willpower to not binge, to remain strong and healthy, to be able to serve God.
- 13. Praise God for all the women and girls of our church, that each one will shine through as a Proverbs 31 woman.
- 14. Pray for our troops to be safe and be able to come home soon, healthy in all areas of their lives. Pray for their families too, as they are separated. That is never easy, but even harder at this time of the year.
- 15. Pray for children in foster care or who are in abusive situations, especially at this time of the year. Pray that someone will come forth to show them love and make sure that they are treated as children should be taken care of.
- 16. Praise God for your friends and family (yes, even the ones who just drive you crazy). Pray for their salvation and overall well being. Many people wish they had a family to celebrate with.
- 17. Pray for our national leaders, that they will turn to God and make decisions based on His will, not based on their greed or self-serving ideas. From the top offices all they way down to local, we need a real turnaround for good moral values and caring for the best for everyone. Pray that the leaders of all other countries do the same.
- 18. Pray for families with children who have autism or any other physical challenges. There is a common perception of what Christmas morning "should" be. But not all families get that reality. Pray for their peace and that theirs's will be a blessed Christmas.
- 19. When you are out shopping and get irritated with the long lines or slow moving people, pray for those around you. It may be God's way of slowing you down, and you may be the only one who has prayed for them in a LONG time. Remember those Heavenly rewards.
- 20. Pray for those in nursing homes or shut off from others because of life circumstances. Age, physical challenges a list of reasons that brings loneliness. Pray for their peace. Is there something you can do as an individual or family to relieve the hurt?
- 21. Here we go again, First Day of Winter. Pray that everyone will be able to stay warm enough. Especially with snow coming and the possibility of no electric, pray for warmth physically and in your heart.
- 22. Pray for the homeless as the weather is cold. Most of them have little to keep them from freezing or starving. Pray there will be shelter for them. Also, that there will be a place for their pets (who may be the only family they have) to be safe and warm. Some of these homeless people are forced to make nearly impossible decisions to be safe.
- 23. Pray for the victims of storms, that power will be restored as well as for those with severe damage. Thank God if you came through unscathed.
- 24. Pray that somehow there will be unchurched people at Christmas Eve services (at our church or any other Bible preaching church) and they will come away with a changed or renewed heart and attitude that lasts forever, that they will choose to return.
- 25. Praise God for coming to earth in the form of a precious little baby Boy. Even then there was the plan for Him to die on the cross for YOU! We must never forget that there are two parts to the same story. But today we say "Happy Birthday, Jesus"!
- 26. Even though Christmas Day is past, there is no reason to stop celebrating. Praise Jesus that we can have the joy of His presence 365 days of the year if we make Him the Lord of our lives.
- 27. Pray for all the other pastors of our church and their families. Each one serves some special mission in our congregation. God has placed them here for specific reasons and they deserve our gratitude and prayer support.

- 29. Praise God that even though it's not always "legal" to pray at public events it does not have to stop us from praying for our country, it's leaders and asking for God's blessings for our country. He knows our hearts. We need to be praying for our country now more than ever.
- 30. Praise God for all the creative outreach ministries that come from our group leaders to touch the lives of so many others. We are so grateful (as are the receivers) that our people can come up with some unusual ways to reach out to those who may have a neutral or not so favorable attitude toward Christ and Christians, and the helpers to carry out these missions. Feel free to get involved and make waves for Jesus.
- 31. Pray that people will celebrate responsibly, that the year will ring out safely for all. Congratulations! God has seen you through 2023. May you have a blessed 2024 and find new ways to celebrate and serve Christ in your life every day.

# **A Thank You And Update**

#### **About The Giving To CGGC-GR Disaster Relief For Maui Fires**

Many donors have given generously to disaster relief efforts in Maui. We are grateful for the outpouring of gifts and prayers. Almost \$50,000 was received at Global Reach for those affected by fires there. After consultation with Pastor Dave Kapaku, funds are being distributed to several nonprofit organizations on the ground there to help provide various forms of on-going relief including food, generators, housing short-term and long-term, transportation for workers' who are displaced, and many other things needed as the recovery continues. We have also provided relief funds to Pastor Dave's church to support families there who have taken in other relatives affected by the fires. These funds will help cover the extra expenses needed to house these family members. Pastor Dave said the biggest efforts now have transitioned into long term housing needs and associated costs. Many of the non-profits are helping in these areas of relief. Pastor Dave and Kenda express their sincere thanks and want you to know that they have what they need, so your giving can be channeled to other mission fields at this time.
