YOUTH & PROMISE KIDZ



Hey Church!

We have just finished our final Wednesday night lesson for **Connection Youth** until the fall. With that in mind, I officially finished my first year of lessons for Connection Youth as the new youth director. I wanted to take this opportunity to first thank everyone for this year. Thank you for your prayers, donations, hands-on help, and support this year. I know for our church in general, it has been a weird year and even more so for our students. Secondly, in this note, I wanted to give a brief snapshot of everything we've been able to accomplish and move forward within our youth ministry. Some of the significant things that we had were several salvations/rededications, built a two-team youth worship team that leads Sunday mornings, changed our name, mission, core values, and look of our youth room.

Biblically, we went through some stand-alone lessons and 4 different series, which included "The Gift of L.I.F.E" (Living In Freedom Eternally), which talked about what scripture says about things like gender, sex, abortion, and more, "I'm Fine" which gave our students a deeper look into anxiety and how we can fight it and move past it, "Made In His Image" where our youth leaders all came together and spoke on various topics of interest tying it all together with the fact that we are different yet the same and "Tasty" a series based on Dr. James Merritt's series from RightNow Media on the Fruit Of The Spirit but edited by our leadership team to fit our group. I am pleased to say that our numbers mainly remained steady. We had several new students join us this year. But most importantly, I was able to connect with and begin developing relationships with many of our students. As we head into the summer, we will be doing things a bit differently this year. In addition to 1-2 fun outing events each month, we will also be offering Youth Discipleship Groups that will separate male and females and include Bible study, so our students are still gathering in holy fellowship and reading the word together throughout the summer. 



The Church Council met on Monday, May 10th. At this meeting we discussed our current COVID guidelines and whether there was a need for any changes. The following changes have been made by a unanimous council.

- 1) All signage was removed from the church. We feel that the congregation does know the protocols as we have now lived with this for over a year. There will be a sign on the entrance doors only stating that "masks are encouraged".
 - 2) The Cafe will be opened. This will only be for coffee at this time.
 - 3) Greetings cards will once again be available.
 - 4) Water coolers will be open for use but water fountains will not be.
 - 5) Hand sanitizer will continue to be provided.
 - 6) Masks will also continue to be provided at our entrances.
- 7) Masks will remain optional. Please remember to respect others and their decisions whether or not to wear them. Also respect and give space to those who wish to social distance.
- 8) At this point we will continue to disinfect the sanctuary between worship services.
- We will continue to allow outside groups to use our facilities. Such as: Karate, CEF, Scouts etc. They are responsible to disinfect after using our facility.
 - 10) All of these changes have already taken effect.

- 3. Pray for those who are graduating from kindergarten, college, trade schools and everywhere in between. New starts can be scary sometimes and finding ways to use that knowledge. Pray that God will provide the circumstances clearly for where they should be and the people they should be associated with.
- 4. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family as they lead and join in our congregation. Praise God for such down to earth people and what they mean to each of us. Pray for the other pastors and their families who serve in our church, either actively or as role models.

Pray for those hurting emotionally, that God's peace will filter into their hearts and they'll be able to look forward to the rest of their life and let go of the past.
