WHAT/WHO does your heart break for?

I'm sure many of you right now have broken hearts for the lives of at least nineteen elementary school children and two teachers whose lives were taken in a matter of minutes at Ross Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, as well as many other shootings over the years.

Since I heard the news report on Tuesday, my heart has been breaking. I've read numerous on-line blogs, social media posts and news articles. Now the printed stories are showing pictures of the students, stories of children received recognition for being honor students that morning, and a girl who called 911 to get help. We also have the teachers who I'm sure did all they could do to protect their students, and a grandmother, who was also shot as she tried to stop her grandson from carrying out this tragedy . . . and the stories, the pain, the suffering, the questions, and the memories continue to go on!

My heart breaks as my thoughts are filled with the innocent children who were injured, traumatized and those who lost their lives. I think of the parents, grandparents, siblings, the families who lost a part of their lives. I think of the children and teachers who witnessed the event, so many lives effected. And I think of the First Responders and medical personnel who responded not just to the Ross school, but also to other tragic event such as this.

So many are suffering great emotional and spiritual turmoil, a pain that will be with them forever!

There are many things and many people we could blame when something tragic like this happens. The arguments for gun-control, the need to have better mental health systems to care for people, better security in schools and other public places, and the list could go on.

These are obviously important concerns, but I believe that **today is not a day for such debates. It is not a day for politics**, and it is not a day to focus on what divides us, but on what unites us

President John F. Kennedy said: "In the final analysis, our most basic common link is that we all inhabit this small planet. We all breathe the same air. We all cherish our children's future. And we are all mortal."

We are all in this life together . . . every child and adult who lost their life on Tuesday (including the shooter), each and everyone of us are made in the image of God (Psalm 139) and loved unconditionally by Him (John 3:16 & 17). **Every victim is being mourned today by loved ones others across our country whose hearts are broken, whose lives will never be the same.**

There is and will continue to be a lot of debate on what we as individuals or as a church are doing to help these families and how can we help when other tragedies happen in our communities. The question many people seems to ask is, "What can I/we do?

I don't want to sound cliché, but the best thing any of us can do in a situation like this is PRAY! Prayer has the ability to change people's lives and people's hearts. We may never hear or see the results of our prayers, but scriptures remind us in James 5:16, "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

When some people hear the comment "we just need to pray"... they say, "You can't just pray. You have to do something." Ecclesiastes 3:1 says. "There is a season for everything under the sun." I agree, there is "season" to pray, and there comes a time when there is a "season" we must get on our horses and do something. However, right now, I am calling each of us to a season of PRAYER!

Prayer isn't something we "just" do. Prayer is not our last resort. Prayer isn't a nice thought. Prayer is our greatest weapon, because when we are praying, we are talking to God and expecting Him to answer.

We may never know the results of our prayers. We may never know what person may come into a relationship with Jesus because they were prayed for. We may never know what tragedy might be prevented, because we prayed for God to change a person's heart, even when we don't even know who we are praying for!

So we pray. We pray that God steps in to this world where He is needed! We pray that God would show us what to do. We pray that others would come to know the Truth through our prayers . . . and then we wait . . . we wait and listen for what God would want us to do!

CALL TO ACTION: I need to wrap this up so here is what I am asking ALL our church family to do. PRAY!

Set a specific time every day and pray. I would like for as many as possible in our church family and friends, to set a daily 1:00 pm prayer time. It doesn't need to be a long prayer. You can pray while working, eating, driving down the road, wherever you are. If you have an alarm on your watch or phone, set it to ring every day at 1:00 and take a moment and pray. If this time doesn't work for you, set another time and stick to it. You might just be amazed at what God can do when we a church family unite our hearts in prayer!


