A fire leaves behind ashes. My prayer is that in this Easter series "From The Ashes" you will come to a place where you allow Jesus to pull you up from the ashes of your life and take you to a place where you can fully embrace all that He has to offer you!



- 1. Pray that all who enter our church will feel the conviction of the Holy Spirit and choose to do what is right by God's laws. Pray for their strength to put God's will first. Pray we will all be able to make everyone feel welcome as God would welcome them to His house.
- Praise God if you woke up this morning reasonably pain free, and were able to get up and moving without help.
- 3. Pray that we can all learn to see problems as opportunities to find new closeness in our relationship with Christ and to see the window that opens when our usual routine is changed and we feel inconvenienced.
- 4. Pray for those going through a shock in their life. So many hugely unexpected things happen and can be overwhelming. Pray the focus can somehow be on Jesus and His comfort to get them through.
- 5. Praise God for music and those who make it. What a talent from God! Playing instruments or singing is a wonderful way to give back to our Lord. A special praise when He wakes you up with a praise song in your heart and ears. Our church is very rich in talented people.
- 6. Praise God for your family (blood or otherwise) and all they mean in your life. They helped to make you the person you are. Pray for their salvation, health and safety.
- 7. Pray for those who are dealing with mental issues, whether it is depression, bipolar, anger or a host of so many other problems they are dealing with. Some of it may be chemical imbalances, but many times it may be just another circumstance in their life, including isolation from Covid. Please pray for their peace in Christ and physical healing.
- 8. Pray for our church council and elders everyone involved in the meeting on church business. Pray that all words and discussions will be spoken with love, patience and wisdom. Especially in these days of weird circumstances, pray that all choices will be clear cut.
- 9. Pray for all the women and girls of our church, that each one will be a good witness to others of Jesus' love.
- 10. Praise God if you can eat anything you want. Many have food allergies (which can be a life threatening situation) or no food available to them. It may not be an issue of "Oh, I don't know what to make for supper", but more like "I wish I had some food to fix for my children". Praise God for Paw Packs, but there are so many more out there who don't have a steady flow of nutrition. How can we help?
- 11. Pray for our troops and their families for safety, a total well being in their lives and that they can come home soon.
- 12. Pray for Pastor Wayne, Elaine and their family. Pray for their total well being in all areas of their lives. Keep all the other Pastors (and their families) in our church in prayer too, that they will be blessed, as well, as they serve God by their actions and personal ministries. God has supplied a wonderful team with a variety of strengths in ministries.
- 13. We may lose an hour's sleep tonight, but praise God that the days are getting longer. More light is a good thing for many people. Don't forget to set your clock ahead so you don't miss church.
- 14. Praise God for our church family, that we can worship and have fun together. Pray for any needs that enter your mind. God can certainly speak to you in many ways. It's always a good idea to listen and lift others up, even people you may not know, but see in passing. You may be the only one who has ever mentioned their name to God. He knows them, but wants us to pray for these souls.
- 15. Pray for those suffering from nasty headaches. It is so hard to function with them. Pray for a cure and relief on a long term basis.
- 16. Pray for those who are having memory problems and those around them. There are so many causes and are very frustrating. Pray for patience and help to heal the problem, for the one suffering and the family and those who deal with the problems.
- 17. Praise God for technology like phones, email, etc. In past ages, if people moved away, you'd never hear from them again. Now it is possible to stay in touch. Pray that people will use it for good and not evil purposes.
- 18. Pray for those who want children so desperately, that they will be able to have their own or that God will show them the one(s) they are meant to have as their family. Likewise, please pray for those women who find themselves in an unwanted pregnancy. Pray they will choose to give that child life. If they don't feel they can keep the baby, that they will have the courage to put the little one up for adoption so many lives will be enriched by being a family together. Pray they will choose life!
- 19. Praise God for all the youth of our church. Pray for their safety in all ways and ability to withstand peer pressure. Pray for all of their leaders, too. This is such an important time in these young people's lives. Pray they will be deeply rooted and can keep growing deeper in His love.
- 20. Praise God that Spring is here. It may or may not feel like it today, but warmer weather is coming along with the new birth of baby animals and beautiful plants to look at. You don't have to own them to enjoy the sight of them. Look around you at the trees and flowers. Who else but God could have come up with such a variety?
- 21. Pray for missionaries around the world, wherever they are. Praise God for our missions committee and all decisions they deal with to make it possible for others to spread God's word and make disciples of others. It is an important team.
- 22. Pray for the nurses, doctors, dietary, cleaning and other personnel who have been working so hard and long hours to take care of those dealing with covid and all other medical conditions. They have put their lives on the line for a long time, now. Pray they will stay safe, physically and mentally and feel the gratitude of the general public for all of their sacrifices.
- 23. Praise God if you can read. So much of our lives revolves around written language. Pray that those who can't read will have their lives enriched by learning how to do so, and good reading material will be available to all. Especially, the Bible would be available to all.
- 24. Pray for marriages, that people will take the vows they made to each other and to God seriously and choose to work through any problems, if possible. But please pray that abuse victims will be able to get away.

- 25. Pray for those in hospitals and nursing homes, that they will get good care and be in great health very soon. Pray especially for those who are missing the homes they have lived in for the biggest part of their lives. Homesickness can be a horrible thing to go through. Pray that very soon, the isolation will be lifted and loved ones can be together again.
- 26. Pray for all the men and boys of our church, that each one will live a life that makes it clear to all who see them, where they stand in their relationship with Christ.
- 27. Praise God for His grace and mercy. No matter how many times we disappoint Him, He always wants us to come back to Him. And He waits for us all with open arms.
- 28. Today is Palm Sunday, the remembrance of the day Jesus went in to Jerusalem to so many shouting Hosanna and praising Him. One short week later, they were shouting to "crucify Him". Pray that we will never turn our backs on Him, but will try our very best to serve Jesus and show His love to others, so they will choose Him, too.
- 29. Praise God for the glorious sunrises and sunsets. Only He could bring those colors to life.
- 30. Pray for those facing huge medical expenses, that the bills will somehow be covered and they can get the care and treatments needed to survive.
- 31. Praise God for the EMTs, police, fire personnel, etc. Their willingness to enter life threatening situations is to be greatly appreciated. Pray for their safety an all areas of their lives.


