Greetings Church!



Not sure if you can remember the first installment in this series. I know I couldn't. I had to look up Junes newsletter myself! Basically this series delves into what being a disciple meant in the time of Christ. In other words, what framework was He working off of when Jesus said 'go make disciples'?

Lets look at that. We've been hearing a lot about discipleship these past couple of weeks. There's good reason for that. It's one of the things Jesus told us to do. It's one of the last things He told us before He ascended up to heaven. Usually the last thing that someone tells us is often very important. This discipling thing is something He wants us to be doing.

Discipleship dates back before Jesus' time. In bible times being a disciple was the way a young man became a rabbi. A rabbi was the Hebrew word for teacher or master. A rabbi would select boys that he thought would make good rabbi's. The boys were usually around 12 or 13, which is the age the Jewish tradition believed a boy became a man. The young man would follow the rabbi around for several years, learning everything he could about the rabbi's teachings, philosophy, way of life; anything and everything. The idea was that when the rabbi died the young man would be at such a place that he could take over where the rabbi left off in his death. We see in scripture that John the Baptist had disciples (John 1:35-37, Acts 19:2-7) as did the Pharisees (Luke 5:33, in addition to Paul, Acts 22:3).

That all makes a lot of sense, but lets peel back that outer layer just a bit more. This wasn't a college course, three days a week for an hour each. Rather, the disciple spent a great deal of time with his rabbi. If we look at Jesus and His disciples we see that they ate together, they walked from town to town together, they bunked together at gracious homes of hospitality, they prayed together, and they witnessed miracles together. One thing that hits me most of all with all of these shared activities is conversation! We talk when we eat, when we're on a walk, long trips in the car, at home when we're relaxing and when we share a room with a spouse, or a roommate, or a child. Jesus' disciples spent an intense three years with Him. They learned a lot about Jesus in that time. They learned what He liked to eat, if He talked in His sleep, how He treated women and servants and children. They heard how He spoke to different sorts of people. They heard the words He used and they noted the words He didn't use. They knew what kinds of jokes He liked to hear and they discovered what caused Him to cry. They found out He could sleep through a gale-force storm and they marveled that He could calm that same storm. And through it all, they heard Him speak truth. These disciples learned about Jesus the Messiah intimately. That was the goal of a disciple. Learn your rabbi. Know him inside and out. Know him so well that you begin to act like him, speak like him, so much that when people watch you and hear you, they know who your rabbi is.

We do this in our lives right now, whether we realize it or not. We begin to act like our friends, our spouses, the celebrities and politicians we listen to, even our pets! People watch us. Whether they know we are Christians or not, they watch us. If we could have a read-out of their brains, who would they say we are most like? Our spouse? Our BFF? Our dog?? Jesus? It's been said that we might be the only Jesus some people ever see. Who would they say Jesus is by just watching us? What kind of Jesus am I echoing...

Simply put, we need to spend time with the Rabbi; our Rabbi. We need to spend time talking to Him, i.e. prayer. Prayer seems a lot more daunting than it really is. It's just talking to Him and listening. Talk to Him while your driving (please don't close your eyes), washing dishes, mowing the yard or walking the dog. Practice having an almost constant conversation with Him throughout your day. Nah, He won't get tired of you. And make sure you leave time to listen. Practice the pause in your prayers. Wait. Listen. Get to know your Rabbi's voice.

One way to get to know His voice is to read what He's already given to us. His Word! The Bible! That book is a huge conversation He's recorded just for you. And in reading that often, you'll learn His voice and you'll learn His ways. That is the goal of a disciple.

That, dear church, is how we get to know our Rabbi.
