Welcome Frica!

We are excited to add to our staff our new Director of Children's Ministries, Erica Shaffer. We asked Erica to share a little bit about herself to help you know her. We are happy to have her as a part of our church family and look forward to how God will be using her in the ministry here as well as her love for helping children "Get Connected" with Jesus in a personal way. Here is what Erica shared with

Good day Newville Church of God family! I am already so blessed to know your community and honored that you trust me to help in the guidance/spiritual nourishing of your children. All that aside I'd love to get to know you all a little bit more so, let me start.

I am from the Chambersburg area and the academic knowledge of who Jesus is and His word was taught to me at Cumberland Valley Christian School through my childhood. I knew how many days Noah spent on the ark, biblical spouses of just about every bible character, the order of the new testament and old, but a personal devotional life to God was absent from me. There was a moment in my junior year of high school where all of that changed. In a time of desperation and confusion I found the God who is never confusing and always there for me. I dove into the New Testament, couldn't get enough of it, one night in my room I told God He was all I'm pursuing, it's Him or nothing.

Following my new commitment to Christ and the end of my high school career I went to an organization called Youth With A Mission, an international missions movement focused on catalyzing youth into the nations — To Know God and Make Him Known. I spent three months learning about the nature and character of God; how I fit into the big plan He has for all of those who love Him. I learned how to hear His voice while He spoke sweet things about a lifelong pursuit. That took me to Nepal for six weeks where I experienced the Lord's heart for every nation, tribe, and tongue.

I'm truly humbled every day by God's command in Matthew 22: 36-40, ""Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." This verse has made me struggle, grow, comforted, and joyful. Jesus is so sweet and at the end of the day I hope to teach your children and amplify in our church how great His love is and how much freedom that gives us.

Erica will be attending our Fall Festival on September 9th. This will be a great opportunity for you to meet her and to introduce yourself to her. Please be sure to keep Erica in your prayers as she begins teaching, building relationships with our children and families and pray for her faith journey to be protected!

Excerpt from Pastor Kahu David Kapaku and his wife Kenda, missionaries from the Churches of God General Conference and pastor of Kahana Door of Faith Church in Lahaina

On August 8th, early in the morning, a brush fire was reported in the hills of west Maui, **close to the town of Lahaina**. By 5 P.M. that day, the town of 13,000 people was engulfed in flames. An estimated 2,200 buildings were lost, and close to 5,000 people were displaced. Due largely to the immense winds from Hurricane Dora, as high as 80 miles per hour, the flames spread quickly, and people had very little warning. Some had none. It seems that the vast majority of the damage was done in just two hours, as high winds kicked up the flames and smoke. Testimonies from people on the ground describe an almost apocalyptic scenario, where the sun was blotted out of the sky by thick smoke, and fires chased people and their pets down traffic jammed roads. Buildings toppled around them, and cars exploded. As the flames moved through the town, some residents of Lahaina were able to squeeze out the sides, going North or South to shelters, but many were caught, forced toward the shore, being smashed between crashing elements of fire and water. The same winds that gave life to the fire was also riling up the ocean. Those who made it to the shore weren't just standing in knee high calm water, but rolling waves.

Speaking with Pastor Kahu David Kapaku and his wife Kenda, missionaries from the CGGC and pastor of Kahana Door of Faith Church in Lahaina, the emotions are high. They are both okay, and all of their physical needs are met, but there is an immense feeling of sadness for the scale of the destruction. "You know once in a while, it hits us throughout the day," Pastor Kapaku said. "Just the idea of the decimation of Maui, and the west side where we live, there are just so many losses. Even at night, we think about it and we try not to. But you can't help... you can't help thinking about what's going on. Sometimes you just break down and cry."

Kenda Kapaku also spoke about the weight that the church is bearing right now, even for those people who are safe. "Of course, it's overwhelming and the people in our church are not fine. It's a lot to carry right now." Kahana Door of Faith Church resides right next to the ocean in Lahaina, and thankfully their church, along with another historic Catholic church, were spared, and continue to help the local people as resource gathering places.

There is a recognition that the situation could have been much worse. Kenda Kapaku mentioned during our interview that, by the grace of God, school was set to start the day after the fire came through. "If all the kids had been in school that day, they would all be gone. The teachers, the parents that were coming to pick them up... there would have been so much more traffic on the streets," she said, tearing up. "I'm just thinking what it could have been if God would have allowed it to happen one day later. So, we thank Him for His grace in that."

Pastor Kapaku continued: "So a lot of people, their employment has been affected by the fires, and we want to look at the funding that comes into Kahan Door and we want to help the family that's hosting [them], with some of the bills that they may be incurring, food, electrical, those kinds of things. I'm looking at a temporary relief for the people that have been affected... It's in the meantime, in the rebuilding process, that the people are going to need help."

If you want to help, the CGGC has an emergency relief fund that goes directly to Kahana Door church to help the people in their community.



PRAYER CALENDAR MINISTRY

- 1. Pray for those who are moving to a new home, that they will get accustomed to their new life quickly and not get homesick. Pray especially for those who are being forced to move from their present homes and circumstances will improve.
- 2. Pray for those who have lost loved ones, that God's love will enfold them and they will have peace.
- 3. Praise God for your loved ones (human or pet) and the joy they bring to your life. Pray for their salvation.
- 4. Pray that the plots of evil people will be stopped before anyone can be hurt and their hearts will be changed by Jesus. In these days, there is no lack of people we need to be praying for very fervently.
- 5. Praise God for all the women and girls of our church. Each one is so important to God and His plans for this world.
- 6. Praise God that the mid week connection groups start again tonight. Do you feel the Holy Spirit calling you to try out one of the classes? It is a great way to get to know your fellow Christians better and learn more about your Lord.

- 9. Pray that there will be a good attendance for our Fall Festival and many unchurched people may see something that will attract them to come back and hopefully come to recognize Jesus as their Lord.
- 10. Pray for those who have been dealing with fires and extreme weather conditions. Pray they will be able to rebuild and have the courage to continue their lives. Pray that loved ones will be safe and together.
- 11. Pray for our council, that there will be wisdom and the Holy Spirit's presence will be felt during the meeting. They are a very dedicated group who have the very best desires to reach all of our congregation as well as outreach ministries.
- 12. Praise God for Pastor Wayne and Elaine, as well as the other pastors and their families of our church. Pray for their complete well-being in every area of their lives. In what seems likely to be a fairly short time until Jesus returns, they have extra pressure on them to speak God's truth in a way people will understand and act on to know they will be headed for Heaven. They need and deserve our support.
- 13. Praise God for Good News! In the midst of a world with so many evil events, we need to cling to all the positive news we can find. As Christians, if nothing else, we have the hope of life in Heaven where it will be good.
- 14. Pray for those who are on oxygen or who have breathing problems that they will be able to get needed air into their lungs, to keep their bodies working.
- 15. Pray for all the males of our church, that each one will grow closer to God and live to be like Him.
- 16. Praise God for First Responders, Police, Firemen, EMTs, Life Lion, etc. Many lives are saved because of their willingness to put themselves on the line. Pray for safety in all areas of their lives.
- 17. Pray for those who feel so overwhelmed by stress that there seems to be no hope. Sometimes we only see now, not what's ahead in Heaven or what God can change here if we repent and ask, believing in His power.
- 18. Praise God that even when doctors say there is not hope, God often has other plans and the power to make those plans happen. Keep praying for those who desperately need that help and hope.
- 19. Pray for people who feel trapped in their life circumstances, that they can find a way out and rely on God for peace and comfort. We can't do it on our own, peace can only come from knowing where your salvation comes from.
- 20. Pray for the leaders of our country that they will truly come to know Jesus and change their behaviors to be truly in line with His will and act accordingly.
- 21. Praise God that when a family crisis occurs, it can pull you together in an even tighter bond, and for the new people who enter your life because of it. Pray that those dealing with it will do so and not be divided, blaming each other.
- 22. Praise God for sending us the messages we need to hear, when we need it the most. How often has a sermon specifically spoken to you? Or someone mentioned something unknowingly? Or something you read made absolute sense on an extremely personal level?
- 23. Pray for those with obsessive-compulsive disorders, that they can hand them over to God (though it's not easy) and find peace.
- 24. Pray that people will show kindness and commonsense in treating others. Too many people are hurting others for "fun". Pray they will be stopped or come to their senses and accept Christ as their Lord.
- 25. Praise God for our Senior members and all they can teach us, even when their memories are not so good, each one has more value than they know.
- 26. Pray for those who are operating big machinery or are anywhere near it, that each one will be safe; likewise, traffic on the highways.
- 27. Pray for those who deal with severe pain everyday, from diseases or medical treatments. Pray they can get relief and rest to help their bodies heal.
